# This is how Youth Summer Fest started

Timis County Youth Foundation (FITT) runs 8 youth centres\* in Timisoara and one in Lugoj.

\*Youth centres are safe spaces for young people, where they can participate or even organise educational, cultural, sports or leisure activities.

To celebrate the European Year of Youth and to offer a programme of activities in preparation for Timisoara's bid to become the European Capital of Culture, FITT organised an international festival throughout August with volunteers from 23 countries that did activities for the public in youth centres and other venues in Timisoara and Lugoj.

# Why did the volunteers choose our festival?

'After applying for many projects and finding out various details, Youth Summer Fest was one of the most remarkable projects as it brings together about 200 people from different countries and cultures and they will prepare activities for the locals. I thought this concept would be a great plan for the summer.' # How was the team building?

The festival comprised two stages of volunteer involvement, which implied creating the calendar of activities, planning the events, providing the logistics and implementing them.

Each of the phases started with a team building session which helped to bring the teams together and get them closer to the FITT staff.






